

INTERAGENCY ACQUISITION AGREEMENT

1. Interagency Acquisition Agreement Number:

2. Legislative Authority: This Interagency Acquisition Agreement is hereby entered into by and between the United States Department of Interior, National Park Service, Black Canyon of the Gunnison National Park/Curecanti National Recreation Area, hereinafter referred to as the NPS, and the US Geological Survey National Water Quality Laboratory, hereinafter referred to as the USGS-NWQL under the provisions of the Economy Act of June 30, 2932 (31 U.S.C. 1535, Pub. L. 97-258 and 98-216).

3. Statement of Work:

A. The USGS agrees to :

1. Complete the work outlined in the attached Scope of Work, Appendix 1.

B. The NPS agrees to:

2. Provide \$28,864.64 payment for the completion of work outlined in the attached Scope of Work, Appendix 1, and the delivery of satisfactory final products.

4. Term of Agreement: The term of this agreement shall not exceed 5 years.

6. Payment Terms:

The maximum total cost liability to the National Park Service for this instrument is \$28,864.64. Transfer of funds to the USGS will be through the Intragovernmental Payment Collection System (IPAC) billing method on an annual billing frequency. Account Number 1377-1004-NZI (Black Canyon National Park/Curecanti National Recreation Area) will be charged. The IPAC billing document, which the USGS-NWQL will prepare, shall contain the following information as the first line of the description or the reference section:

A detailed list of charges incurred will be made available upon request. Any excess funds not used for the agreed costs shall be refunded to the National Park Service upon expiration of this instrument.

7. Termination Clause:

Either party, in writing, may terminate the instrument in whole, or in part, at any time before the date of expiration. Neither party shall incur any new obligations for the terminated portion of the instrument after the effective date and shall cancel as many obligations, as is possible. Full credit shall be allowed for each parties expenses and all non-cancellable obligations properly incurred up to the effective date of termination.

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**Appendix 1
Scope of Work**

A. The National Park Service (NPS) requests that the U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) National Water Quality Laboratory (NWQL) provide analysis of surface water samples collected from Black Canyon National Park/Curecanti National Recreation Area. NPS requests analysis from the following NWQL Schedules:

Colorado - Park Service Curecanti Project Trace Metals, Water

NWQL Schedule 1119 (with deletions Lab Codes 1985, 2331, 1986, 1978)
S1119 NWQL, Low Level Nuts + P + Microkjeldahl P and N
\$61.70 (with lab code deletions)

Per agreement with the National Park Service (Black Canyon National Park and Curecanti National Recreation Area) and the USGS Colorado District, regional overhead has been waived and only the 12.0% WOTSC overhead will be added to all samples.

Analysis Cost: \$24,772
Supplies through NWQL: \$1000
Overhead Cost (12%): \$3092.64
Total Analysis, Supplies and Overhead: \$28,864.64

7 rounds of 19 samples (133 samples total) each (includes 1 blank and 1 duplicate per round) will be collected and require analysis in FY2005. Sampling will begin in mid-late November 2004. Holding times, analysis, and quality assurance will be consistent with USGS-NWQL protocols. Specialty supplies required through the National Field Manual (conductivity standards, filter capsules, etc) will also be obtained through this agreement

B. Analysis and associated quality assurance data will be acquired by USGS personnel in the Colorado District, Grand Junction Office for quality assurance review. Data will then be delivered in a timely manner to NPS staff in an Excel electronic format.
